Sunday Church is a Saturday Decision

Dearly Beloved,

I'd love to be able to say that I came up with "Sunday Church is a Saturday decision," but alas, it is a borrowed phrase. However, I couldn't agree with it more. Of course, for me, Sunday Church is a *life decision* - a vocation. To put it bluntly - I am required to be in church on Sundays. It is my job. But it is much more than that for me. It is indeed a vocational calling.

For some of you, Sunday Church is no longer a choice to make - it has simply become a part of your weekly routine and habit. But for *most* folks, Sunday Christian Formation and Worship is a *choice*. For families with young children/toddlers/infants - developing a routine of Sunday Christian Formation and Worship can be difficult. Kids need to be fed, dressed, and corralled. And unlike weekdays, there are many other options for how to spend a Sunday, including doing absolutely nothing!

The easiest way for me to connect with the struggle that folks might have with getting to Christian Formation and Worship on Sundays is related to my struggle to get to the gym in the mornings. One thing I have learned about myself is that if I leave the decision to make a 5:30 AM class at the gym to "whether I feel like it" in the moment, I will never make it. The fact is that I never *feel like* going to the gym at 5:30 AM. For me, the decision must be made the night before. And the decision also involves me telling Emily so she can help keep me accountable when I try to turn off my alarm in the morning.

As we approach a new program year here at The Advent, I would like to encourage us all to do all that we can to make "Sunday Morning Church" part of our weekly routine and habit. And by "Church" I mean Christian Formation (Sunday School) and worship. I have been so impressed by the variety of Christian Formation offerings we have for all ages at The Advent. There truly is something for everyone.

For elementary-aged children, we are introducing Godly Play, which y'all will quickly fall in love with. Youth Sunday School and Confirmation classes will resume as well. The Fall series for The Seekers class will be "Sacred Signs, Sacred Stories, Sacred Service." And The Gleaners, The Sowers, and The Village will also have offerings that you will want to check out.

So, for those of you who on Sunday mornings feel like I do on weekdays when my alarm sounds at 5:00 AM for my gym class, try making your Church decision the night before. Indeed, until it becomes an ingrained habit and routine that you no longer have to think about or decide, Sunday Church will need to be a Saturday decision. And I trust that it will be a decision that you will be glad that you made!

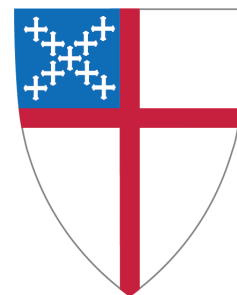

Adult Confirmation: "Do you renew your commitment to Jesus Christ?" (p. 415, BCP)

This Fall, I am excited to be introducing a new approach to Adult Confirmation classes. The reality today is that it is nearly impossible for a candidate (or a priest!) to be available for a one-hour class 12 weeks in a row. Who has three months' worth of uninterrupted Sunday mornings or Wednesday evenings? I know that I don't!



So, we are introducing a "module" approach to Confirmation classes. To be confirmed, there are six 2-hour modules one must take - Holy Baptism, Holy Eucharist, The Daily Office (Morning & Evening Prayer), Prayer, Holy Scripture, and Polity/Governance/Stewardship/Lay Leadership.

Each season (Fall, Spring, Summer), the modules will be offered for one to take as their schedule allows - one doesn't need to take them in a particular order. You can take all the classes in one season, or you can take them over a period of a few years - whichever approach you prefer.

Since this is a new approach, and Bishop Daniel is coming in November, this Fall, we will offer each module *twice* (once on a **Thursday from 9:00-11:00 AM**, once on a **Sunday, 12:00-2:00 PM - light lunch will be provided on Sundays**) but candidates only need to attend *one* of the two classes per module. Classes will be in the Library Conference Room on the first floor of Satterlee Hall.

I encourage any and all adults to take these classes - not only those who are seeking to be confirmed. Perhaps you were confirmed 50+ years ago and would like a refresher course (particularly if you were confirmed prior to the 1979 *Prayer Book*). In my previous parish, each year there would be a few adults who had been confirmed as a teenager decades ago, and took the class. When the bishop visited, they received the laying on of hands and renewed their Baptismal Vows (liturgy is found on p. 413 in the *BCP*). In each case, it was a very poignant, moving thing to witness. It became "a thing" at Christ the King, and as a result, we developed a culture of well-catechized adults, which I believe is critically important in this post-Christendom age in which we live.

Here is the schedule this Fall:

1. **The Holy Eucharist:** Sunday, August 23 and Thursday, August 27 (pick one)
2. **The Daily Office:** Sunday, August 30 and Thursday, September 3 (pick one)
3. **Prayer:** Sunday, September 13 and Thursday, September 17 (pick one) - *Mtr. Paula will facilitate*
4. **Holy Scripture:** Thursday, September 24 and Sunday, September 27 (pick one) - *Mtr. Paula will facilitate*
5. **Polity/Governance/Stewardship/Lay Leadership:** Thursday, October 1 and Sunday, October 11 (pick one) - *Fr. Richard and Mtr. Paula will co-facilitate*
6. **Holy Baptism:** Thursday, October 22 and Sunday, October 25 (pick one)

I am excited to introduce these classes and this approach to The Advent. It is a privilege to journey alongside you as together we seek to "continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of the bread, and in the prayers."

I am delighted to share with our parish family that I have completed the two-year Spiritual Direction Training Program through the Haden Institute. This has been a deeply meaningful journey of prayer, study, and spiritual formation that has strengthened my own relationship with God and prepared me to accompany others as they seek to recognize God's presence in their daily lives.

Spiritual direction is a ministry of holy listening. It is not counseling, advice-giving, or problem-solving. Instead, spiritual direction provides a safe and prayerful space where a person meets regularly with a trained spiritual director to reflect on their experiences, notice the movement of the Holy Spirit, and grow in their relationship with God. Richard Rohr says that spiritual direction is the practices of holding space to "second the motions of the Holy Spirit". It is not about a director offering advice or wielding control; rather, it is a collaborative companionship that helps a person notice, trust, and surrender to God's active presence in their everyday life.

What I like about the definition is that it points to the holy spirit as the true director. My role as the human director is that of companion, acting as a sounding board, raising questions and bearing witness to the movements of God in another person's life. I offer a second set of eyes and ears to the work and voice of God.

This ministry can enrich the life of our parish by supporting individuals in every season of faith—whether they are seeking a deeper prayer life, discerning a life decision, navigating change or loss, or simply longing to become more attentive to God's presence. Spiritual direction reminds us that God continues to speak and guide us today. I look forward to sharing this ministry with our parish community and walking alongside those who desire to deepen their spiritual journey.

PRESERVATION & MAINTENANCE UPDATE

The Church's One Foundation

One of my favorite hymns is S. J. Stone's *The Church's one foundation* (Hymn #525 in *The Hymnal* 1982). Each stanza merits an article of its own, but for now, I'd like to focus on stanza 4:

*"Mid toil and tribulation,
and tumult of her war
she waits the consummation
of peace for evermore;
till with the vision glorious
her longing eyes are blessed,
and the great Church victorious
shall be the Church at rest."*

Over the past few weeks, you may have noticed that we have removed some landscaping around the edges of the Church building, Pendleton Hall, and Satterlee Hall. You also may have noticed some digging around the foundation of the north side of Church building. This work is a follow-up to the report we received from Building Solutions, who we contracted with in late 2025 to do an analysis of our physical plant.

The report was extensive, and we have assembled a Campus Preservation & Maintenance Team to prioritize and address the issues pertaining to stewarding our historic and sacred buildings. We have hired a structural engineer, a civil engineer, and have engaged an historic preservation consultant to further assess the needs related to the Sanctuary, Pendleton Hall, and the Cleveland Bell Tower.

No major construction is imminent but you will see signs of activity over the next few months as we assess and prepare for a larger project.

Indeed, our beloved, historic buildings have suffered *"toil and tribulation, and tumults of her war"* (the war

simply being 100+ years of battle with sun, rain, wind, sleet, and snow). There are so many things that we would love to repair, renovate, and improve on the *inside* of our sanctuary and Pendleton Hall. But before we do that, we need to ensure that the foundation of our building remains solid.

*"till with the vision glorious
her longing eyes are blessed,
and the great Church victorious
shall be the Church at rest."*

I look forward to the day when we can be assured that our beloved, historic Church building and Pendleton Hall are "at rest" on a solid, safe, and secure foundation.

But in the midst of our faithful, hard work on this project, we must not forget the *true* foundation of why we are here, and why all of this matters - *Jesus Christ our Lord*. He is the one, true foundation of the Church. So, our building projects aren't an end in and of themselves. Rather, they exist to draw our hearts, minds, and bodies towards our Triune God. And thus, we sing stanza 5:

*"Yet she on earth hath union
with God, the Three in One,
and mystic sweet communion
with those whose rest is won.
O happy ones and holy!
Lord, give us grace that we
like them, the meek and lowly,
on high may dwell with thee."*
